THE VERB

A verb is a word that tells of an action or state of being.

Action verbs are verbs of doing something: hope, dream, run, speak.

ex. I read many magazines. Dolores ate the taco.

Linking verbs describe a state of being. These verbs link the subject to a noun or adjective.

ex. Jim is sleepy. Sue was tired.

The word <u>be</u> is a linking verb, as are its forms: <u>am</u>, <u>are</u>, <u>is</u>, <u>was</u>, <u>were</u>, <u>be</u>, <u>been</u>, and <u>being</u>. Other linking verbs include <u>appear</u>, <u>become</u>, <u>seem</u>, <u>sound</u>, <u>feel</u>, <u>remain</u>, <u>stay</u>, and <u>look</u>.

ex. Helen seems calm. The children remained quiet.

Linking verbs can become action verbs when they indicate action.

ex. I felt the soft fabric.
